

## July and August Mission focus A Rocha's Peru's Dry Forest Programme

The aim is to support local communities in Pacasmayo District, Northern Peru in restoring, conserving, and sustainably managing dry forest landscapes.

Climate Stewards is supporting them to provide fuel-efficient cookstoves to low-income families living in isolated areas. Each cookstove gives a family a safer, cleaner and more efficient way to cook, lowering the risk of injuries from burns, lung and eye problems due to smoke, and reducing pressure on local forests.

**As an Eco Church we are keen to support such initiatives as each stove will save 2.65 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> per year**

On Tuesday evening this week we had two quite different events. Jane was hosting a meal for the staff, support staff and governors of Long Marston school celebrating the amazing work which our Church Schools do in caring for and nurturing our children. We are incredibly blessed by the quality of schools and those who work and volunteer in them across the parish. Thank you to all of you.

At the same time I had the joy of Deane Synod. We were joined by Rob Wickham CEO of Church Urban Fund. He reminded us that it is now 40 years since the publication of the report Faith in the City. It was a report which was condemned as being Marxist but it came out of a time when the country moved from 13% of people living in poverty to 25% living in poverty. Many churches were horrified by this and were motivated into action; £60 million was quickly raised and spent on projects to alleviate the worst effects of poverty. Sadly, in the 40 year since poverty has not dropped significantly and still hovers around the same level.

In the Tring Team Parish we are relatively well off. In terms of overall deprivation we rank 10771 out of 12178 C of E parishes where one is the most deprived parish. In terms of child hood poverty we are at 7% (compared with St John the Baptist, Standbridge also in our Diocese and only 10 miles away at 34% or St Peter's Blackpool which has the worst childhood poverty of any C of E parish at 58%). As we read who is my neighbour in our Gospel today we should be recommitted to working against poverty. In particular we give huge thanks for the amazing work which Prue and Grahame have done over so many years championing the cause of the Children's Society and working with those children who are most vulnerable
