This Sunday's Gospel is the parable of the talents, and as with many parables, it is a complex one. I can understand the meaning that we are here to use our skills for the benefit of all, but the power of the man who is referred to as harsh, and that fact that he has slaves sometimes obscure for me the central meaning. It is a reminder of the complicate nature of language: how meanings change in translation, how culture affects it, and that we have to keep interpreting the Bible because of this. One of the fascinating aspects for me is that the word talent originally meant a coin or a set weight, but it is this parable that made it mean ability or skill - once again, the Bible has had a huge impact on language. It is a reminder that to do nothing with our talents is disrespecting God; they are given to us for a purpose and the purpose is for the benefit of others. The slaves are not told to keep what money they have made, but that there is more they can do. So I suppose the question is really how are you using your skills? Are you using them for God and for the church? So many of us see the church as somewhere that should give to us, and support us, but we are the church and we have our role to play. Whether it is music or cleaning or welcoming or intercessions or leadership, we all have our part to play.

## Taking a closer look at John's Gospel.
