

Please remember that it is your responsibility to contact these people to confirm the details of your wedding. You must confirm with them what is required two months before your wedding.

Legalities

Marriage is both a religious and legal ceremony. It is important that we follow the correct legal procedures. The normal legal process is for banns of marriage to be published in church. Banns may be published for:

- I. anyone who lives within the Tring Team Parish;
- 2. anyone with a 'qualifying connection' with the Tring Team Parish;
- 3. anyone on the church electoral roll of the Tring Team Parish.

There is more information about this on a separate sheet

The Publication of Banns

Your banns will normally be called in Puttenham at 3.30pm Service on the first 3 Sundays two months before your wedding - i.e. if your wedding is in June then your banns will be called on the first three Sundays of April. You should attend at least once when they are read. Where one or both of you, live

outside the parish, you must contact the vicar of the parish in which you live to arrange for banns to be called in that parish church. After they have been called a certificate will be issued (for which you will have to pay a fee). You must give the certificate to the minister conducting your wedding. They have to have seen this before the wedding can go ahead.

Marriage in church after divorce

The Church teaches that marriage is a lifelong commitment. However we recognise that for number of reasons marriages can fail. Since 2002 the Church has made it possible, in some circumstances, for there to be a subsequent marriage after divorce. If either of you has been married before please mention this at an early point. There will need to be a frank and open conversation about the previous relationship.

Other information

Officiating Minister

It may not be possible for the Rector to conduct your service, however we are part of a Team parish and there other priests who can conduct your service. The Rector will let you know well in advance.

Orders of Service

You will need to discuss this with the minister conducting the service to ensure that order is printed correctly.

Church Music

Live music is often preferable. The organ in St Mary's is perfect for a small country church but please remember it isn't the same as some of the mighty instruments in the great cathedrals. Please talk to our organist to make sure that the music you choose will work on it. You may also wish to visit Tring's website www.tringchurchmusic.org.uk to look at some suggestions. There are recordings of entrance and exit music, recordings of hymn tunes and the words, and suggestions for the signing of the registers.

Wedding Costs for 2021

The basic wedding cost is £536, which includes the marriage fees as laid down by Parliament, the fee for the Publication of Banns of Marriage, the Marriage Certificate. We do not add anything to this basic legal fee. However we hope that you will seriously consider making a donation of £50 to the church. This can be gift aided. Between October and March we will put the heating on full first thing in the morning BUT even then in a medieval church it will not be as warm as in your house!
