

- Organist £130** Any special arrangements demanding significant additional time on the part of the organist may be charged additionally at £30 per hour by prior agreement. Special music and solos can be arranged by our organist if requested. Soloists are to be paid by you directly as a private arrangement
- Choir £130** The choir may not always be available.
- Bells £200** The full peal of 8 bells will be rung for 1/2 hour after the service. If you would like 6 bells only this is £150.

Flowers in Church Our church flower team are happy to help out for a limited number of weddings each year. They are able to offer a simple pedestal and pew ends in keeping with the church. Those who wish to have elaborate arrangements should go to a professional florist. However, please note flowers can be incredibly expensive. Think about what is important. Our flower team have a wealth of experience about flowers in church are always happy to talk to you for advice before you go to a professional florist.

What happens next? - Before the wedding

Space to think (12—6 months before) we would like to meet up with you to think about the vows you are going to make. We would also like to invite you to join us at our Sunday morning services so you can get used to the church and to have an opportunity to think about the vows you will take in the presence of God.

The Order of Service (4—2 months before) we would like to meet up with you to when you have had a chance to plan your service, but before it is printed to make sure everything is in place and to answer any of your questions.

Banns we will invite you to hear your banns being called on the first three Sundays two months preceding your wedding

Rehearsal we would like to have a rehearsal one evening in the week before your wedding

What happens next? - After the wedding

Wedding Certificate remember you will need to apply for this

First Anniversary we will invite you back to church on your first anniversary when we will pray for you.

A final word

We are not a wedding business, we are a church. As such we do not take a deposit for your wedding. If your plans change please let us know. And remember we are here to help you so don't hesitate in calling for more information, or speak to someone after the services in church.

Please remember that it is your responsibility to contact these people to confirm the details of your wedding. You must confirm with them what is required two months before your wedding.

Legalities

Marriage is both a religious and legal ceremony. It is important that we follow the correct legal procedures. The normal legal process is for banns of marriage to be published in church. Banns may be published for:

1. anyone who lives within the Tring Team Parish;
2. anyone with a 'qualifying connection' with the Tring Team Parish;
3. anyone on the church electoral roll of the Tring Team Parish.

There is more information about this on a separate sheet in your wedding pack. You will need to show something to confirm your identity (passport, photocard drivers licence etc) and something else that would confirm your address, utility bill, bank statement (not more than 3 months old) to the minister before your wedding to prove your nationality, this can be done at one of your meetings. If you are not a British or European national please let the minister know as soon as possible so that a superintendent registrar's certificate can be arranged in good time. If in any doubt at all please call the minister. If you are planning to change your name and get a new passport for the honeymoon, there is a form the clergy can sign to enable this.

The Publication of Banns

Your banns will normally be called in Tring at the 10am Service on the first three Sundays two months before your wedding - i.e. if your wedding is in June the banns will be called on the first three Sundays in April. You should attend at least once when they are read. Where one or both of you, live outside the parish, you must contact the vicar of the parish in which you live to arrange for banns to be called in that parish church. After they have been called a certificate will be issued (for which you will have to pay a fee). You must give the certificate to the minister conducting your wedding. They have to have seen this before the wedding can go ahead.

Marriage in church after divorce

The Church teaches that marriage is a lifelong commitment. However we recognise that for number of reasons marriages can fail. If either of you has been married before please mention this at an early point. There will need to be a frank and open conversation about the previous relationship.

Marriage Certificate

Marriage certificates are no longer issued at the time of marriage. You will need to apply online at <https://www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/certificate> after the wedding. The cost will be £11 for each copy and will be posted via 2nd Class Post. You should receive your certificate within 15 days of applying.

Other information

Officiating Minister

It may not be possible for the Rector to conduct your service, however we are part of a Team parish and there other priests who can conduct your service. The Rector will let you know well in advance.

Orders of Service

You will need to discuss this with the minister conducting the service to ensure that the order is printed correctly.

Church Music

Our organist will help you with your music choices for the wedding. You may wish to visit his website www.tringchurchmusic.org.uk/weddings to look at some suggestions. There are recordings of entrance and exit music, recordings of hymn tunes and the words, and suggestions for the signing of the registers. Please make contact with the organist at the earliest opportunity.

Wedding Costs for 2023

We try and keep the cost of your wedding as low as possible. The basic wedding cost is **£569.00**, which includes the marriage fees as laid down by Parliament, the fee for the Publication of Banns of Marriage, and a charge of £30 which is paid to a verger to get the church ready for your wedding.

We do however hope that you will make an additional donation of £50 to the church. This is voluntary so that those who really cannot afford to pay are still able to get married in church. Also by being a donation you are able to gift aid this part of your wedding fee.

Between October and March we will charge an extra £50 for heating. This will cover an hour before the service and the actual service but please note that it won't ever get as warm as a house!
